WATER  • Drowning • Hypothermia • Locks  GENERAL INJURIES/ILLNESS	INSTRUCTOR CLIENT INSTRUCTOR	LOW	<ul> <li>Emphasise risk at briefing.</li> <li>Group always supervised by an adult.</li> <li>Adults carry first aid kit and communication equipment.</li> <li>Near canal lock chambers close supervision maintained.</li> <li>Centre staff to carry throw line and mobile phones.</li> <li>Ensure first aid kit is carried.</li> <li>Ensure medical conditions are known and appropriate medication carried.</li> </ul>	
	CLIENT		<ul> <li>General care for hygiene.</li> <li>Ensure students are aware of the danger of barbed wire.</li> </ul>	
CHILD PROTECTION	INSTRUCTOR	LOW	<ul> <li>Always take care that conduct towards young people cannot be misinterpreted.</li> <li>Avoid being alone with a young person.</li> <li>Advise young people to be cautious towards strangers.</li> <li>During expedition young people in company of others and adults.</li> </ul>	



STUDENT MANAGEMENT	CLIENT	LOW	<ul> <li>Make behavioural expectations clear to all people.</li> <li>Work in small groups with two adults present.</li> <li>Constantly monitor numbers of young people.</li> <li>Account for all people on return to mini-bus.</li> </ul>
TRAFFIC	INSTRUCTOR	LOW	<ul> <li>Ensure all appreciate rural Highway Code.</li> <li>Reinforce rules of the road whenever necessary.</li> <li>Ensure all people use underpass walkways when available.</li> <li>First aid kit carried by adult with mobile communication.</li> </ul>
